With the help of our partners, in 2014 Food For The Poor Canada has achieved remarkable change in communities across Jamaica and Haiti.

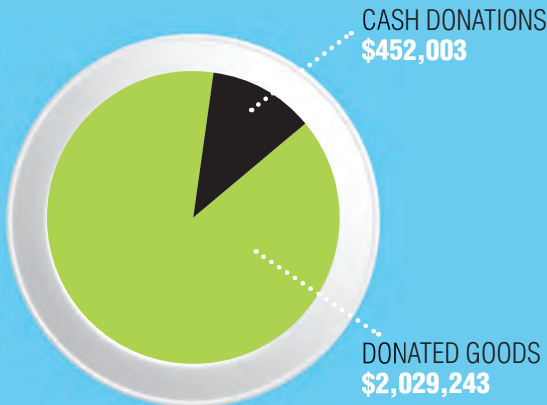

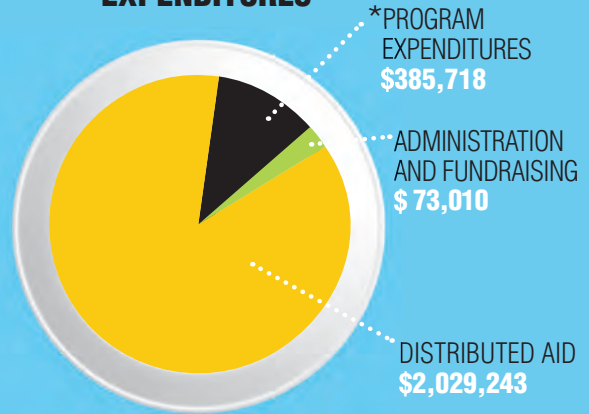

In 2014, we lost our Patron and advocate, G. Raymond Chang. He supported the work of Food For The Poor, because in his words “Food For The Poor identifies the need and *Gets It Done.*” Ray had a way of bringing to focus the things that were important and urgent and he “got it done.”

Ray shared Food For The Poor's commitment to education, sustainability and a hand up; he leaves a legacy through his work, his philanthropy and his family.

Last year Food For The Poor internationally hit a few milestones in the *Getting It Done* category: we built our **100,000th house** in the region and completed the 50 schools project which set out to build 50 schools in 50 months in Jamaica; we had so much support for education that **50 schools were built in 30 months.**

Thank you to our donors in Canada who built **10 of those 50 Schools**, you have changed individual lives as well as communities.

FOOD AND HEALTH

In 2014 you sent medical, educational and food donations of over **\$2 million dollars** to people in Jamaica and Haiti, whose lives have been made better by your generosity.

Food For The Poor Canada partners with Health Partners International of Canada to **ship much needed pharmaceuticals** that are distributed to the poor in Haiti and Jamaica at public hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies. Most of the patients cannot afford to pay for medicine, so these are **life saving and life changing** for those who receive them.

We shipped soup, baby blankets and school supplies where they were distributed to orphanages, schools, prisons and churches.

Food For The Poor internationally, with its donors *gets it done* by **feeding half a million people** in the Caribbean and Latin America every day.
