

### TOOLS FOR CHANGE VILLAGES AND LIVELIHOOD

### SAN ANTONIO, HONDURAS

You built a **new agricultural school**, Vocacional Urquia. This is the first school in the community for children **beyond grade six**. By having access to farmland and **greenhouses on school property**, students gain hands-on skills in the trade sector.

You helped local farmers, by giving them supplies and technical assistance to **produce their own honey** and **grow their own coffee**. The farmers received 21,000 coffee plants and their own individual beekeeping kits thanks to you!

More than 40 women attended women's empowerment workshops because of you. They improved their skills in sewing and baking, and grew their knowledge in creating and growing their own businesses.

### BARAMITA, GUYANA

You built a bright and **beautiful new library** in the rural village of Baramita, Guyana. The children are making the most of their new library stocked with tablets and books filled with knowledge about their community, country and the world.

### **JAMAICA**

The **24th school** built by Helping Hands Jamaica Foundation and Food For The Poor is now complete! Goodwill Early Childhood will give children between the ages of 3 and 6 a strong learning experience. **50 Jamaican children received lunch, textbooks and tuition fees, and you also provided <b>70** tablets with access to WIFI.

# TOOLS FOR CHANGE HEALTH AND FOOD

#### **HEALTH**

You provided free medicines that doctors gave to their patients who were unable to afford them. Thank you for shipping three containers of medications and medical supplies to hospitals and clinics in Honduras, Jamaica and Haiti in partnership with HPIC. You also gave newborn kits to new mothers that contained diapers, onesies, hats, blankets, socks, stuffed toys, washcloths and soap.







### F00D

You provided healthy lunches to 90 children for the school year at Every Child Counts in the Bahamas, a school for children with physical and mental disabilities.

Thank you for sending **2.6 million meals** to families and children across Jamaica and Haiti in 2021. You shipped a container of beans and four containers of dehydrated vegetable soup **donated by Canadian farmers** and volunteer gleaner organizations across Canada. With your kindness, we were able to ease hunger in schools, hospitals, homes for the elderly, and orphanages.

# TOOLS FOR CHANGE EMERGENCY RESPONSE

#### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE**

You helped us meet the immediate needs of Haitians following the 7.2-magnitude earthquake in August. With your generosity, we shipped three containers of essential supplies; masks, isolation gowns, aqua tabs, food, and emergency kits that fed and protected families.

After the **St. Vincent volcano**, you helped cover the cost of the **clean-up in the community.** In **Guyana**, **you provided clean water** to a community that was flooded by sending **480,000 water purification tablets.** In **Jamaica**, you provided **200,000 isolation gowns** with our new partner GlobalMedic. The gowns were sent to healthcare workers to help **reduce Covid-19 infections** in their communities.
