



Programming & Shipping Impacts in 2022

Food Security

3,131,481 People Impacted*

(856,536 Haitian/1,087,430 Jamaican/1,186,953 Honduran/562 Guyanese)

Kuru Kuru Primary Feeding Program

- The school lunch program began in March 2022 and will run until March 2023.
- 42 children from low-income homes are being provided one meal a day for the entire school year.

Jamaica School Feeding Program

- 1,430 Jamaican students were supported with school lunches in 25 schools across Jamaica.

Baramita Christmas Food Hampers & School Garden Project

- 30 families in Baramita received food hampers in time for the Christmas holidays in an effort to increase food security in the community.
- 400 students now have access to a school garden that's being used to grow vegetables and teach students about sustainable agricultural practices.

Food Shipments

- 3,129,489 meals were shipped to Jamaica, Honduras, and Haiti with our food partners Ontario Christian Gleaners and North Okanagan Gleaners.
- 2022 marked a milestone for FFPC of over 25 million meals sent since 2010.

Education

685 Students Impacted (400 Guyanese/285 Jamaican)

A Device for Every Child

- 70 tablets with 6 months of data were purchased for students in Jamaica to support with digital literacy.

Valley Christian Ministry Basic School

- 90 students received a new school 3-classroom school in July to create greater and safer access to education.



Bourne Gordon's Pre-school and Kindergarten

- Our 25th school with partner Helping Hands Jamaica Foundation, 85 students received a new 5-classroom school in August to create greater and safer access to education.

Give These Children a Chance Program

- Over 40 students were supported with school scholarships that covered the cost of tuition fees, lunch, and books.

Education Shipments

- 400 backpacks filled with school supplies were shipped to the students of Baramita. Soccer clothing and equipment and 400 pairs of shoes (that expand up to 5 sizes as a child's feet grow) were also shipped.
- 1,400 books donated by the Niagara-on-the-Lake Public Library Board, and over 200,000 pencils were shipped to Jamaica.

Health

376,583 People Impacted* (122,215 Honduran/211,701 Jamaican/42,667 Haitian)

San Antonio Health Centre

- The health clinic has been completed and officially opened in August. The clinic will support about 1,000 residents living in and around the San Antonio community.

Health Shipments

- Shipped over \$1.7 million in value of medicine and PPE to Honduras and Jamaica for distribution among hospitals and health centres, with the help of HPIC and GlobalMedic.
- Shipped over 2.8 million aqua tablets for water purification and for inclusion in disaster relief kits to Honduras and Haiti.
- Shipped 520 menstrual hygiene kits with Help a Girl Out for young women living in children's homes in Jamaica and Honduras to provide greater access to sanitary and hygiene products.
- Shipped 60 sleeping mats and 468 newborn kits to Honduras.
- 200 Lucky Iron Fish were sent to Honduras to provide dietary supplementation of iron to individuals affected by and to prevent iron-deficiency anemia.



Livelihood

169 People Impacted* (48 Guyanese/121 Honduran)

Baramita Chicken Project

- 12 Baramita families have been supported with chicken coops and have been provided training, chickens, and chicken feed for a source of income-generation.

San Antonio Vocational School and Greenhouses

- The construction of the greenhouses on the school property has been completed. One greenhouse will grow up to 60,000 coffee plants as well as fruit trees (orange, lemon, mandarin, avocado, and mango)
- The second greenhouse is used to grow vegetables like peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, carrots, beans, and squash.

Coffee Farming, Beekeeping, and Women's Empowerment Training

- Beekeeping, coffee farming, and women's empowerment training projects continued to take place.
- A total of 13 coffee farmers and 3 beekeepers have been supported with tools and training for income-generation.

Transportation School Scholarships

- To-date, 22 students have been supported with scholarships to be able to attend truck driving school.

Housing

64 People Impacted* (32 children/32 adult Haitians)

Derac

- The final 15 homes were completed in March, and all 60 families have now moved in.

Barriere Battant

- An additional home was built in the community of Barriere Battant.
