
Ti Ayiti Feeding Program

Project Summary

In partnership with FFTP Inc., the Ti Ayiti Feeding Program will **provide 253 children** at the Ti Ayiti School in the impoverished community of Cité Soleil, Haiti **with a nutritious breakfast for 10 months** to give them the energy they need to focus in class. Each month, students will receive food items such as: bread, peanut butter, cereal, sugar, milk, cheese, powdered juice, eggs, water, and a nutritional drink.









Impacts

- Receiving a meal every morning will contribute to increased student attendance and improved grades.
- School children often come to school on an empty stomach, complaining of having cramps and headaches. By giving them a meal, they will have the **energy to focus and perform better in class.**
- Parents will be happy to know that their children are eating every morning since they struggle to feed them at home, and can instead buy other basic necessities.
- Meals will provide nutrients for healthy growth and development, reducing instances of illnesses caused by malnutrition.
- The school will see **reduced drop-out rates**, as a meal at school is often an incentive to attend classes regularly.

"Due to [unrest in the area], the administration had decided not to open for the academic year 2022-2023. Despite this, the parents requested that the school be opened as soon as possible so that the students could begin the school year. Although the school has been open, we are still lacking in logistics. The school yard has been flooded with muddy water. Fortunately, no damage has occurred to the classrooms. The situation in the region is still dangerous. Bullets are still being fired near the school. Gang members have threatened to invade Cité Soleil's west side; however, we will continue to do our best to provide these children with the best education possible."
